

PORT TERMINALS SEEK EXEMPTION

Legislation Provides Relief for Violations of Law

The Federal Maritime Commission has forwarded legislation to Congress that would enable the agency to forgive possible past law violations by port terminals that failed to submit rate agreements to the commission.

The commission chairman, John Harlee, said that the bill was intended to relieve waterfront operators of the threat of millions of dollars in fines.

The threat of heavy penalties stemmed from a Federal court ruling in 1961 that agreements such as leases were subject to the Shipping Act of 1916 and thus were required to be filed with the commission before becoming effective.

After the court decision the nation's pier and terminal operators told the F.M.C. that they hesitated to file because they would in that way disclose previous violations on which fines as high as \$1,000 a day could be assessed.

The bill sent to the House and Senate last week seeks to amend the Shipping Act to provide for the exemption of certain terminal leases from penalties.

Bill Provisions Cited The bill says in part that the penalty provision of Section 15 of the Act "shall not apply to leases, licenses or assignments of terminal facilities which were entered into before Oct. 1, 1963."

Under Section 15, all maritime rate agreements, including ocean freight pacts and terminal contracts, must be filed with the commission.

The commission has referred the bill to the subcommittee on the nation's pier and terminal operators.

Meanwhile, the committee hopes to have Mr. Kennedy assign some funds for the construction of a pavilion. It also hopes to get financial aid from individuals and foundations.

If need be, the committee is willing to wait until the second year of the fair to build its own exhibit hall.

However, August Sak, who has designed a connected four-building exhibit area for the committee, insists that for \$1 million or \$1.5 million the pavilion could be erected in 90 days.

"Our efforts have come to nothing," Mr. Geller said, "because there isn't sufficient interest on the part of the World's Fair officials, nor on any governmental level—city, state or Federal."

He said that at the 1939 World's Fair, the World's Fair itself constructed a pavilion in which 1,200 works of contemporary American art were shown.

At yesterday's meeting, Philip Reisman of the Artists Equity Association said the United States was "run by bookkeepers who equate everything with money."

"In all their bookkeeping, human values and cultural values are not one item on the ledger," he said.

Leonard Bernstein, the composer and conductor, in a statement read at the meeting, said that without the arts the fair would be "inconceivable, incomplete and unrepresentative."

Saved by Russians, Flier Dies in Crash Of His Jet Upstate

WELLS, N. Y., Nov. 17 (AP)—An Air Guard pilot rescued from the Atlantic three months ago by Russian fishermen was found dead today in the wreckage of a jet fighter that had crashed in the Adirondacks.

The victim was Capt. Hugh A. Lavallee, 29 years old, of Springfield, Mass. He disappeared on a training flight from Westfield Air Base yesterday.

The wreckage was spotted by a Civil Air Patrol plane from the Pisco Lake airport.

Captain Lavallee, who had been flying weekend missions, was an insurance salesman.

In August, he was forced to bail out of a jet over the Atlantic. The Russians picked him up and turned him over to the Coast Guard.

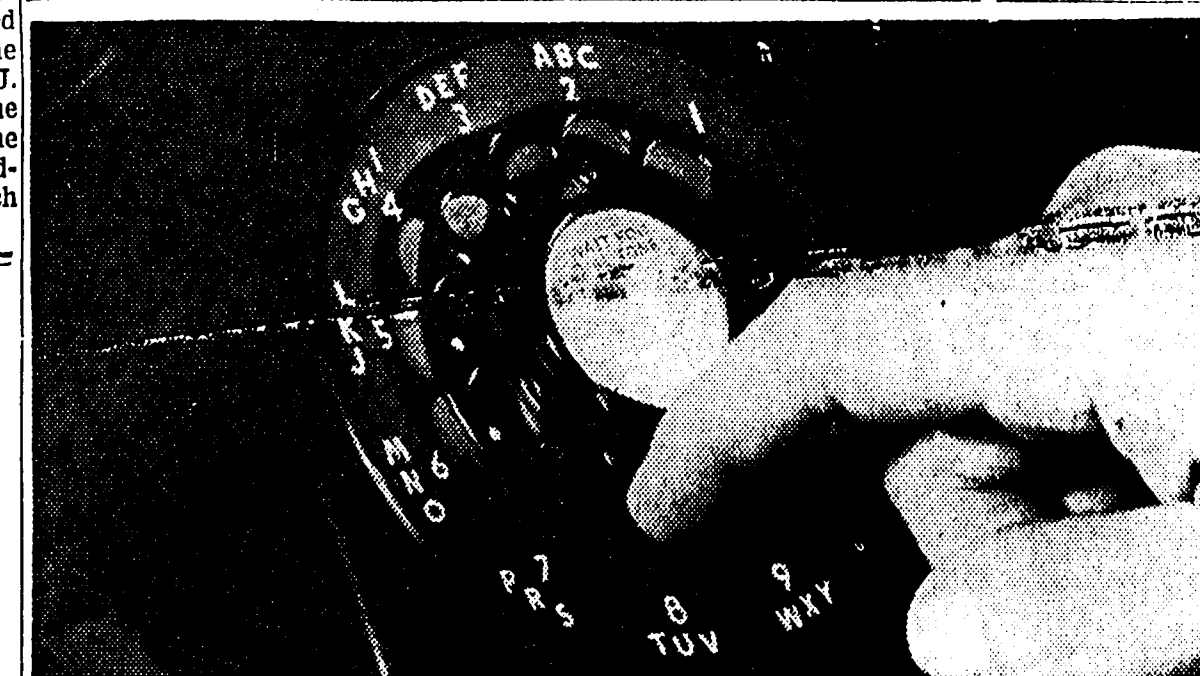

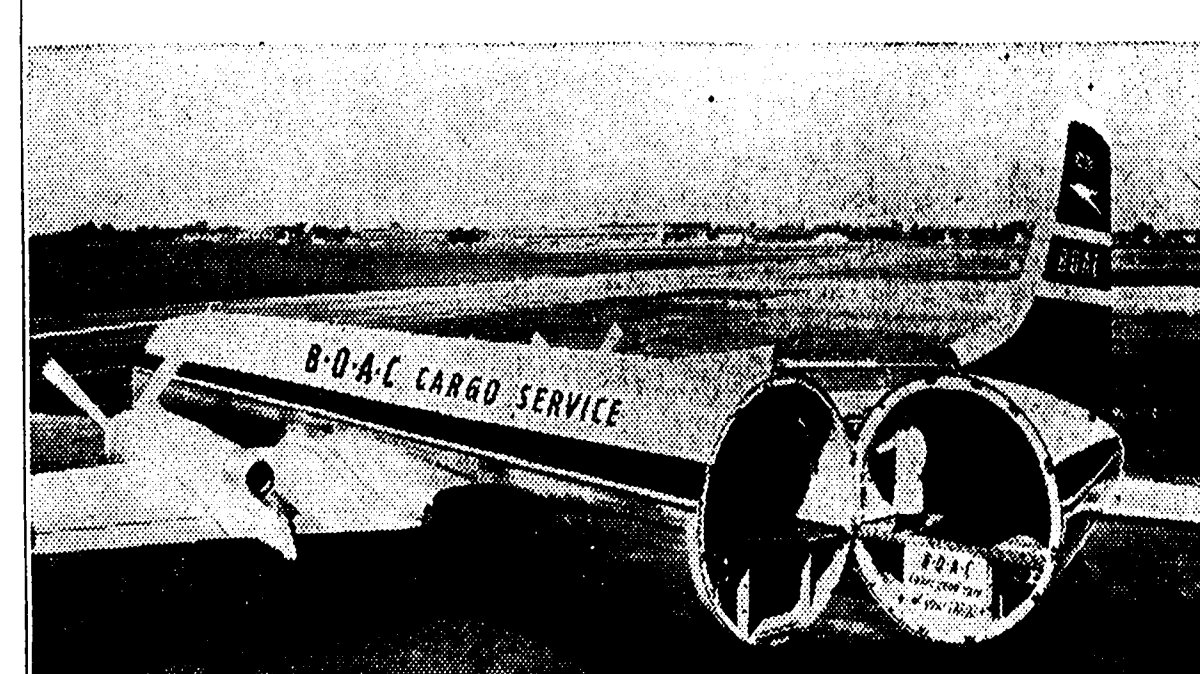
Air National Guard pilot was killed today when his F86H jet fighter crashed into trees after completing a strafing run at a gunnery range south of here.

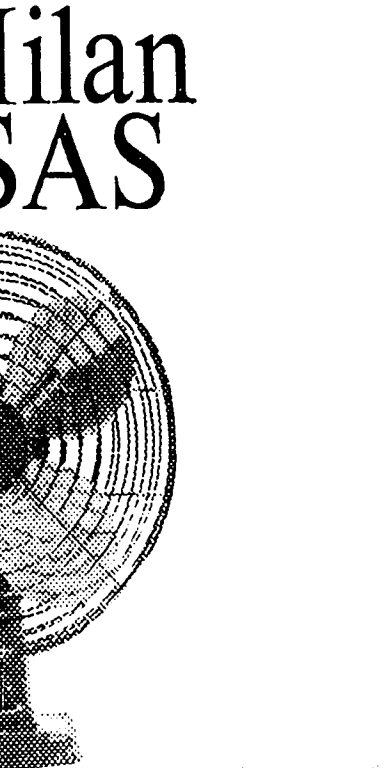
